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# Wedding firm wins award for second time

Winning the Trustpower Customer Service Award at the Westpac Rotorua Business Excellence Awards is becoming a habit for The Wedding Guy.

Peter and Valeta Duncan built on their 2009 success to further improve on what they offer clients to pick up the same award again this year.

"[Last year's win] challenged us to look for ways to become better as a business," Peter told The Daily Post.

The couple have been streamlining their business model and re-entered the award to affirm they had created a leaner, more efficient company, without losing the personal aspect of the business.

Not content with organising and acting as celebrant for weddings, The Wedding Guy is in the process of setting up its first Rotorua Wedding Show to showcase wedding and special event products and services from across the Central Park area.

Running at the Rotorua Convention Centre on April 16 and 17 next year, it will feature everything from a ladies only "Honeymoon Masquerade" lingerie show, indigenous canapes by chef Charles Royal, ice sculptures by Sabretooth Ice's Logan Shipgood, a bridal fashion show, local DJs and

There will also be a "mancave" retreat for "any bloke wishing to escape the wedding show".

Duncan believes it is the first wedding show of this type in New Zealand to feature an evening event, giving guests the chance to enjoy Rotorua's sights and activities during the day.

New wedding adventure packages are also in the pipeline, ranging from extreme adventure honeymoons to luxurious resort and spa get aways.

Duncan said one of the key elements of the company's customer service was access to The Wedding Group, which now consists of 46 wedding-related businesses.

"Ongoing growth of this network provides ease of access for our clients to highly regarded and experienced specialists in the wedding industry, without the need for brides and grooms to spend unnecessary time vetting photographers, florists and venues - as we've already done the work alreadv."

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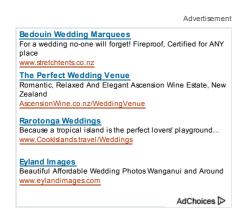
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The Duncans have not decided whether they will be entering the customer service category again in 2011, saying it is a huge investment of time and resources.
